

The next parade is St. Patrick's Day. We will tune up some extra kazoos for anyone wanting to join us!



Mahalo to Lea Ka'aha'aina who is the Outreach and Communication Specialist for the 'Alalā Project. She spoke about the Hawaiian Crow to increase awareness of their plight prior to the November release into the wild of 12 fledglings. In addition, she asked the keiki to share their descriptions of the 'alalā and their vision for them in the wild to assist the 'Alalā Project people in giving names to the fledglings.



Today, the Hawaiian crow is considered the most endangered of the family Corvidae. [3] They are recorded to have lived up to 18 years in the wild, and 25 years in captivity. Some Native Hawaiians consider the Hawaiian crow an 'aumakua (family god). [1]
